


CASE DEFINITION

Suspected Case: Any person with acute illness and demonstrates insiduous onset of sustained fever, headache, malaise, anorexia, relative bradycardia, constipation or diarrhea or abdominal tenderness progressing to prostration.








GENDER WISE DISTRIBUTION





























DISEASE WISE DISTRIBUTION






Diseases with number of cases between 100 & 1000


